<p>Week 1</p>	<p>VCe Consonant-Le</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - VCe Syllable is “magic e, silent e, etc.” The e makes the vowel say its name. - C-Le The le “grabs” the consonant in front of it and makes it part of its syllable. (ble, gle, etc) - When teaching, it is helpful to teach that the C-le stays together and circle it. That way the syllable left determines the vowel sound. <p>*Suggested Order: Closed Syllables double consonants - <i>wiggle</i> closed Syllables – <i>nestle</i> Open Syllables – <i>table</i> Vowel Team – <i>steep</i> R Controlled – <i>purple</i></p>	
<p>Week 2</p>	<p>Diphthong /oy/- oi, oy</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A diphthong is a vowel team that has one sound with two mouth positions. - Usually oi is found in the middle of a syllable and oy is usually found at the end of a syllable. 	
<p>Week 3</p>	<p>Diphthong /ow/- ou, ow</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A diphthong is a vowel team that has one sound with two mouth positions. - Usually ou is found in the middle of a syllable. It is the most frequent spelling. - ow is usually found at the end of a syllable. It can be found in the middle of the syllable if followed by an l or n.
